

Every senior took a letter home last week with information about senior portraits. All senior portraits need to be taken by November 4th Please make sure to call and schedule a time that best works for your student and you.

All 9th, 10th, and 11th grade students will be taking the PSAT on October 19th. Many students take the PSAT, not only as preparation for the SAT taken in senior year and widely used as a major criterion for college admissions, but also to qualify for the National Merit Scholarship Competition. As with the SAT, the PSAT has separate math and verbal sections and a third section that tests English grammar. Each subject is scored on a scale of 20 to 80 and these scores are combined to create the National Merit Scholarship selection index. The test has a fee of \$15 and only the juniors are eligible for a fee waiver. Please know that fee waivers are distributed based on the information provided on the lunch application.

The most common reasons for taking the PSAT/NMSQT are:

- To receive feedback on your strengths and weaknesses on skills necessary for college study. You can then focus your preparation on those areas that could most benefit from additional study or practice.
- To see how your performance on an admissions test might compare with that of others applying to college.

- To enter the competition for scholarships from the National Merit Scholarship Corporation (grade 11).
- To help prepare for the SAT. You can become familiar with the kinds of questions and the exact directions you will see on the SAT.
- To receive information from colleges when you check "yes" to Student Search Service.

Students may practice before the test by going on <https://www.khanacademy.org/sat>.

Halloween Expectations



In an effort to enjoy and celebrate Halloween at Animo Venice Charter High School appropriately, respectfully, and in accordance with school rules, we ask that students use the following guidelines when selecting a costume:

2. Costumes that are provocative, revealing, sexual in nature, or employ questionable props are not permitted.
3. Costumes that depict violence, alcohol, or drugs are not permitted. No fake weapons will be allowed of any kind.

5. Please be mindful of others when you are designing/choosing your costume. Do not wear anything that might be offensive or make anyone else uncomfortable.
6. Costumes should not hinder your ability to participate in your classes, including P.E.

Costumes may not disrupt or impede traffic, or present issues of safety in the hallway.

Students wearing questionable costumes will be asked to change into school loaner uniform. If you have any questions regarding the appropriateness of your costume idea, we encourage you to speak with admiration.
